

Second Distribution of Seafood Compensation Program Overview

- 1. Introduction.** On November 18, 2014, the Court approved the Seafood Supplemental Distribution formula established under the Court-Designated Neutrals' Recommendations for Seafood Compensation Program Supplemental Distribution. The Court approved a partial Supplemental Distribution targeted at \$500 million of the remaining undistributed portion of the aggregate \$2.3 billion fund for the Seafood Compensation Program. Payments will be disbursed in multiple phases. This is the first supplemental distribution from the Seafood Compensation Program following initial payments to qualifying seafood claimants.

The initial payments on qualifying claims under the Seafood Compensation Program totaled more than \$1 billion. The Settlement Agreement and Neutrals' Recommendations provide that any balance of the original \$2.3 billion still remaining after the first distribution will be divided among claimants determined eligible to receive compensation in the first distribution. The Neutrals will make recommendations at a later time concerning the disposition of any funds still remaining after this first supplemental distribution.

- 2. Right to Object.** The individual claimant and BP have the right to object to the calculation of a claimant's Seafood Supplemental Distribution Award Amount within 30 days the program notifies the claimant of the award. This means that a claimant will not receive payment until the objection rights expire.
- 3. Release.** If a claimant has not previously signed a Full and Final Release Settlement, and Covenant Not to Sue ("Release"), they will be required to sign the Release, that is provided to the claimants and submit the original, signed Release before the program can issue payment.
- 4. Additional Documentation.** Some claimants may be required to provide additional documentation to receive their share of this supplemental distribution. The Settlement Program will notify those claimants in the coming months of the steps required to receive their supplemental distributions.
